First Semester includes handwriting, stories, fables, and nursery rhymes to provide a rich serving of literature and language. Second Semester moves towards applying newly acquired skills using journaling. Each student performs at his/her level.

Title: Writing E-Newsletter (AL 102)

Category: Arts - Language

Description: In this class students will write a news page on the Shanan website. The web page may include local, national and Shanan news. They will learn to write and edit. Each week your student will be responsible for writing one article for the webpage. Students will write titles, introductions, topic sentences, paragraphs and conclusions. The focus will be coherent writing. Students will also learn grammar and techniques of good writing. We will cover several aspects of news and advertising communication. This means we will have fun learning attention grabbing techniques and discuss the psychology involved in news and advertising. Furthermore, we will address the issue of ethics and our constitutional right to freedom of the press. Students must be able to read and write at a minimum of a 4th grade level and must write their article even if they miss class.

Description: Speak Up, Speak Out – Public Speaking for 7th through 9th graders. The ability of people to speak publicly has influenced our lives throughout history. Kennedy inspiring a nation to touch the moon, the skill of moving the emotions and swaying a debate can be powerful when learned to be used properly. Topics covered will include: poetry, prose, oratory, and debate. Children will leave this course with the ability to write their own speeches and have the confidence to perform them. Homework will be assigned each week which will normally take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Larger speeches and research for debates may take more time to complete. All students will be encouraged to participate in a student congress at the end of the year, date TBA. There is no maximum number of students for this class, but if a minimum number of 4 students is not reached, the class may be canceled (teacher will determine).

Title: Drama I (AP 109)**Category: Arts - Performing**

Description: Drama is both a literary and performing art. In recognition of this, students will perform an original play one semester and write a class play the next semester. As part of performing the play students must be able to read and memorize lines and perform on stage. Parents may be asked to help with costumes and set. Most of the written class play will be composed in class as a collaborative effort. (Students are not required to hand write the play though they may be asked to hand write on a few occasions. The teacher will write their ideas. The goal is to produce one page per week and at the end of the semester each student will receive a copy of the play.) All students who participate will be listed as authors of the play. Principal elements might include characters, motivation, setting, plot, and theme. The goal is for children to appreciate and understand the "writing" process.

Title: Drama II (AP 110)**Category: Arts - Performing**

Description: Drama is both a literary and performing art. In recognition of this, students will perform an original play one semester and write a class play the next semester. As part of performing the play students must be able to read and memorize lines and perform on stage. Students will develop the art of storytelling or acting. They will learn acting techniques and develop a working knowledge of a few theater terms. Parents may be asked to help with costumes and set. Each student will be required to write an original play. Each week we will discuss a component of a good play, such as characters and conflict, motivation, setting, plot, theme, etc. Along the way students learn what constitutes a tragedy, comedy and satyr. The goal is for students to turn in one scene per week (approx one or two typed pages). By the end of the semester each student should have written a simple play or skit while developing a deep appreciation for the art of literary drama. Topics covered will include: general math, geometry, algebra, trigonometry, statistics, and probability. Children will leave this course with not only a better understanding of mathematics, but a desire and ability to succeed in mathematics. Homework will be assigned each week which will normally take approximately 30 minutes to complete. There is no maximum number of students for this class, but if a minimum number of 4 students is not reached, the class may be canceled (teacher will determine).

Topics covered are Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Earth Sciences. The desire is to promote a love of Science and to show how it affects our daily lives. Most of the material we will use for our experiments are everyday items found in the home. Some of the items will come from purchased kits. We will learn how to use a microscope to study things like plants, fungus and micro organisms.

We will study things like ph, gases, air, water, energy, force, and motion, to name a few. Some of our experiments will include making a balloon jet car, a musical laser, a slide whistle, a motor speaker, and air cannon. These are general ideas for the areas we will cover. If for some reason a specific experiment can not take place it will be replaced with one of a similar experiment. The idea is to have fun with Science and to learn a little about how it all works.

Children will leave this course with the ability to create their own experiments and have a renewed excitement for science. Homework will be assigned each week which will normally take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Larger experiments may take more time to complete. All students will be encouraged to participate in a science fair at the end of the year, date TBA. There is no maximum number of students for this class, but if a minimum number of 4 students is not reached, the class may be canceled (teacher will determine).
